

Healthcare Financing Dashboard, Kaduna State aims to close data gaps and offer stakeholders a clear, concise view of financial allocations and healthcare expenditures. For example, the dashboard will allow policymakers to monitor health expenditures in real time and compare released funds to those received by healthcare facilities. This will enable the identification of bottlenecks in fund disbursement highlight areas and where additional support is necessary, particularly in underserved rural areas.



NFTI Commences 6-Month Study to Assess PHF Readiness in Kaduna

The Natview Foundation for Technology Innovation (NFTI) has commenced a sixlongitudinal study aimed evaluating the operational readiness and data systems of public health facilities (PHFs) across three Local Government Areas (LGAs) in Kaduna State. The study is assessing non-clinical primary health care (PHC) readiness, with a special focus on Human Resources for Health (HRH), Supply (SCM), and Chain Management associated data systems.
