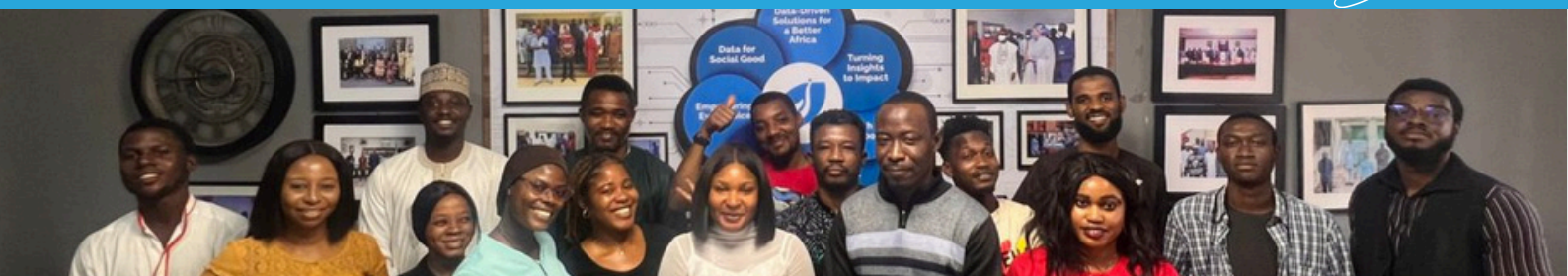
KDBS, NFTI Working to Standardize Statistical Processes through SOP Validation Workshop
